## **CLP’s Power the Youth Expedition Brings Zhanhuang Students to Hong Kong to Explore New Quality Productive Forces and Strengthen National Identity**

CLP Holdings Limited (CLP) organised a six-day immersive study tour in Hong Kong for 23 teachers and students from Hebei Zhanhuang Middle School in Hebei Province from 26 February to 3 March 2026. The tour is aimed at deepening mutual understanding between young people from the Chinese Mainland and Hong Kong, enhancing their understanding of new quality productive forces, introducing them to cutting-edge practices in energy transition, and strengthening their sense of national identity through interactive learning.

Guided by the theme of “Understanding New Quality Productive Forces, Strengthening National Belonging” and building on the successful pilot programme in Shandong in 2025, this year’s Power the Youth Expedition maintained its tripartite collaboration model involving government, enterprise, and schools. The tour was supported by the Hong Kong and Macao Affairs Office of the State Council and the People’s Government of Zhanhuang County, Hebei Province.

Over the course of the six-day itinerary, participants explored Hong Kong’s green energy development and cultural vibrancy. They visited CLP’s Black Point Power Station and the CLP Power Low-Carbon Energy Education Centre, gaining first-hand insight into natural gas-fired power generation and the decarbonisation journey of Hong Kong’s power system. At T-PARK, they learned about Hong Kong’s innovative waste-to-energy solutions. Through expert-led seminars and hands-on renewable energy workshops organised by CLP, students developed a keen interest in sustainability and more concrete ideas about future careers in technology and environmental fields.

Beyond energy studies, the programme featured rich cultural activities. Visits to West Kowloon Cultural District and the Hong Kong Palace Museum showcased modern interpretations of traditional Chinese culture, while tours of the National Security Exhibition Gallery and Hong Kong Museum of History – complemented by a CLP-

produced national security education video – enhanced participants’ awareness of national security.

A highlight of the tour was the establishment of a sister-school relationship between Hebei Zanhuang Middle School and Kiangsu-Chekiang College. Witnessed by CLP Power Chief Corporate Development Officer Ms Quince Chong and representatives of the Zanhuang County Government, the two schools signed a cooperation agreement on 2 March. The partnership will facilitate curriculum collaboration, reciprocal visits between teachers and students of the two schools, and resource sharing.

At the signing ceremony, Ms Chong said, “As CLP commemorates 125 years of service in Hong Kong, supporting youth development continues to be one of our community commitments. Last year we took Hong Kong students to Shandong Province; this year we welcome Hebei students to Hong Kong, demonstrating the two-way exchange of the Power the Youth Expedition. The initiative aims to empower young minds in exploring the origins of cultural heritage and the fundamentals of energy sources in support of the nation's strategic push for new quality productive forces. Through CLP’s energy expertise, we enable young people to witness the Mainland’s energy transition achievements and understand how new quality productive forces drive high-quality development, while strengthening cultural bonds and national pride.”

Kiangsu-Chekiang College Principal Mr Fong Chung Lun said that he was honoured to form partnership with Hebei Zanhuang Middle School, noting that the exchange builds cross-regional friendships and cultivates a new generation of youth with a strong sense of national identity and global vision. Kiangsu-Chekiang College student Zhou Shi Qi shared, “Hearing Zanhuang students talk about the changes in their hometown in recent years deeply moved me. I now understand that prosperity and security are the results of generations of hard work—and we must encourage one another to move forward together.”

Hebei Zanhuang Middle School Principal Mr Ren Jianyin described the tour as a valuable learning opportunity, particularly in broadening students’ horizons and deepening their national identity. He hoped that the sister-school partnership would serve as a foundation for educational collaboration. First-year senior high school student Yang Zhuoyuan said, “Visiting Black Point Power Station enabled me to have a close look at natural gas power generation and carbon reduction technologies—making the concept of ‘new quality productive forces’ tangible. Exchanging stories with students from Kiangsu-Chekiang College also helped us understand the campus life and local culture in Hong Kong and realise that we all hold beautiful hopes for the future.”

Launched in 2025, the Power the Youth Expedition leverages CLP's expertise and experience in the energy sector, creating a cross-regional and interdisciplinary learning platform for students from Hong Kong and the Mainland. Integrating green technology, cultural heritage, and national education, the programme aims to nurture a new generation with a strong sense of national identity and global vision.


