CLP CEO Discusses Regional Cooperation and Energy Transition Investment at APEC Forum

T.K. Other panellists included Canada's Parliamentary Secretary to the Minister of Energy and Natural Resources Mr Corey Hogan, Papua New Guinea's Minister for Energy Mr Peter Namea Isoaimo, Peru's Minister of Energy and Mines Mr Guillermo Shinno Huamani, Director-General of the International Renewable Energy Agency Mr Francesco La Camera, Executive Director and President of China National Petroleum Corporation's Economics and Technology Research Institute Mr Lu Ruquan and Vice President of China Longyuan Power Group Corporation Limited Ms Ding Jing.

Speaking on the role of regional cooperation, Mr Chiang said platforms such as APEC help bring together governments, businesses and financial institutions to share experience, develop practical solutions and facilitate cross-border investment. He added that the Belt and Road Initiative can support the flow of capital, technology and expertise into clean-energy and infrastructure projects across the region.

He noted that realising these opportunities will require significant investment, while investor confidence is built on clear policy direction, transparent market mechanisms and visibility on long-term returns. In this respect, Hong Kong has a distinctive role to play in mobilising capital for the region's energy transition.

"With deep capital markets, a broad global investor base, sophisticated professional services capabilities and close connectivity with the Chinese Mainland, Hong Kong is well positioned to serve as a 'super connector' and 'super value-adder' – linking capital with clean energy and infrastructure opportunities, and helping to advance Asia Pacific's energy transition. As an energy company headquartered in Hong Kong with a regional footprint, CLP will continue to support this transition through disciplined investments across the region," said Mr Chiang.

China is the host economy for APEC in 2026. The 16th APEC Energy Ministerial Meeting and the 12th Asia-Pacific Forum on Energy Sustainable Development and the High-level Dialogue between APEC Energy Ministers and Business Leaders are key events held during the “APEC Beijing Energy Week”, which aims to promote energy cooperation in the Asia-Pacific region.
